Executive Committee Meeting Notes June 29, 2022 – All Saints Episcopal Church (and via Zoom)

Scott Hayes welcomed Robert Baird, Jason Brown, and Tim Hall as new Executive Committee members, and thanked outgoing members Jackie Bitler-Row, Landry Duvall, Joel Kumro, and Carina Brackin for their service.

Kenna Payne presented Chapter Financial Statements through 6/30/22. Dues revenue stands at 100% of the budgeted amounts. Stock market swings have taken a toll on the investment account (net YTD loss of \$5,593). She also presented a financial report for the Organ Repertoire Recital Series. Fund raising has been strong, and revenue exceeded expenses for the 12 months ending 6/30/22.

Kenna Payne presented the proposed chapter budget for FYE 6/30/23. Budget amounts are based on activity levels of the chapter and amounts from the just-completed year. She also presented the proposed budget for the Organ Repertoire Recital Series for FYE 6/30/23. Four recitals are planned.

Kenna Payne provided an update on the POE+ session scheduled for August 7-12, 2022. There are 13 participants registered, with 2 more in process. There will be daily workshops in the morning, with lessons and practice time in the afternoon and evening. Additional teachers are still being sought.

Scott Hayes and Zach Bultemeier, Program Committee Chair, presented plans for chapter programs for September 2022 – May 2023.

POE+ UPDATE

(Editor's note — since this newsletter isn't coming out until early August, some of the information below may be out of date, but there may still be help needed for the POE+, so you can certainly check with Steve and Kenna if you are around and looking to volunteer!)

STILL LOOKING

We are down to about 5 weeks to go before the start of the POE+ event that our chapter is hosting. We still have some ways that the chapter membership can help. As of now we have 12 confirmed and registered participants, with 2 more that we have been told are going to register. The registration deadline is (was?) July 1st, so we will know the final number soon.

The schedule is pretty well set, and we've got a variety of workshops, an organ crawl, and a visit to an organ building shop planned in addition to the daily lessons. The student recital at the week's end will be held on Friday morning, August 12 at 10:30 AM at Second Baptist Church. All members of the chapter are invited to this recital, and we hope many of you will attend to support not only the participants, but also the POE+ program in general. Watch for the final location and time.

We're enclosing a copy of the summary schedule, as it exists today, 6/24/22. The event will be based at the Holiday Inn Express at the corner of Gaskins Road and Mayland Avenue in the west end (just north of I-64, using exit 180). Daily breakfast and the morning workshops, as well as a few other meals, will be held at the hotel. Our greatest need at this time is for volunteers. Here are some of the specifics volunteering tasks for which we need help. Note that the POE+ requires that all participants and volunteers have received all COVID vaccines and will need to provide a copy of such. Additionally, all required masking and social distancing requirements of the churches, restaurants, etc., must be followed.

REGISTRATION – Participants will start arriving that Sunday afternoon, 8/7/22, and all who have checked in will be leaving from there to St. Stephen's Episcopal Church for their Celtic and Compline services, with dinner there between the services. We need someone to help set up the registration table, check people in, and to stay with the registration table until all have checked in. This will probably be from 2 PM to 8 PM.

"GO-FERS" – Because the participant group will be moving back and forth to multiple venues, individually and together, we'll be having catered lunches prepared for several of the meals. If the food is ordered at Publix, Ukrops, Great Garden, etc., it will need to be picked up at the ordered location and delivered to the lunch venue, set up for the meal, and cleaned up after the meal. We are finalizing those meals and locations. The go-fer is always invited to share in the meal he/she is delivering.

<u>DRIVERS</u> – Some of the participants will not have a car in town, or might not be willing to drive other participants in their own car. So, we may need volunteers to drive participants to and from lessons or other events. We are still waiting on complete information from the participants, so this will be among the last arrangements we finalize. You will need to provide a copy of (a) a valid Virginia driver's license, (b) current vehicle registration, and (c) proof of current insurance coverage. If you are willing to drive, knowing that the need is flexible, wonderful! Because this volunteer role might be alone in a car with a sole participant, the AGO requires that the volunteer undergo a background check and complete an online anti-sexual harassment training (all teachers and the co-directors will have to do this, too). If you can help with this, let Steve know right away, so the appropriate process can be started as soon as possible.

JOINERS – We invite you to join the group for the some of the afternoon and evening events, if space allows. This would be a chance to welcome these participants to Richmond and provide a few faces and names for them to get to know. Please us know if you're interested.

EATERS and **SOCIAL BUTTERFLIES** – We invite chapter members to join us for the daily breakfast (Monday – Friday, at the hotel) and/or the non-restaurant lunches or dinners. Let us know which you will attend and we'll add you to the list.

EQUIPMENT – The hotel's conference room doesn't have any equipment for us to use. Could someone loan us a keyboard and / or a white board and easel for a workshop on Wednesday morning, 8/10/22, please? The workshop starts at 7:45 AM at the hotel. We can speak with you about getting it/them and setting them up.

Don't forget that monetary gifts also support this program. Any amount will help, and contributors will be recognized in the event's program, and in the September newsletter. CHAPTER LIFE UPDATES


