EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING NOTES

June 20, 2023 – All Saints Episcopal Church (and via Zoom)

Scott Hayes presented Financial Statements for the Chapter and for the Organ Repertoire Recital Series (ORRS) through 6/20/23 (11 months of the fiscal year). Dues collected so far represent 99.9% of the budget for the year.

Scott Hayes presented the proposed budgets for the Chapter and for the ORRS for FYE 6/30/24. Both budgets were approved.

Michael Housden, Investment Advisor, Morgan Stanley, gave a presentation on the Chapter's investment accounts. The focus has been on a diversified portfolio to minimize risk. Year-to-date investment returns stand at 7.85%.

Scott Hayes and Melissa Hawks are managing social media. Melissa Hawks will be editor of *The Stoplist*.

A keeper is needed for the "local events" calendar on the website. It was suggested that it be designed to be more contributor-focused, where submissions could be proposed and then approved by a keeper.

Bruce Stevens provided an overview of membership issues

- AGO National has shortened the grace period for dues payment from two months to 10-14 days after the due date.
- Our chapter continues to lose members, a trend that is apparent across the country.
- All AGO members need to communicate the value of AGO membership to our church musician colleagues in the Richmond area.

URGENT - NEW DUES POLICY

The AGO national office has implemented a new policy concerning dues payment and their due date. As of now, there is NO GRACE PERIOD after the due date of your renewal. Memberships renew at the beginning of each month of the year, based on the member's date of joining the AGO OR on July 1st, if the member was a member in 2014, when the ONCARD database system became effective. Within the Richmond chapter, as I'm sure is true nationwide, most memberships renew on July 1st.

The new policy DOES NOT provide for any grace period of paying dues beyond the renewal date. So, if you have a renewal date of July 1st and do not make your payment by that date, your membership will be cancelled approximately two weeks later. This pattern of processing will occur with every renewal date during the year. The AGO accepts payments by both credit cards and personal check. You can pay your dues by credit card in two ways. First, you can go online into your ONCARD account, select RENEW DUES AND SUBSCRIPTION, and follow the prompts (you will be asked to confirm / update your membership profile). You can print a copy of the invoice and/or receipt (after the payment is processed). Second, you can call the AGO office at 1-212-870-2310 and pay your dues with a credit card over the phone. AGO staff can also help you with any ONCARD problem.

You can also pay your dues by check, and will need a copy of the invoice to do that. You can get a copy of the invoice at your ONCARD account, or by calling the AGO office (number above). If needed, Chris Martin (1-804-405-2528) or I (1-804-512-5804) can get a copy of the invoice printed and to you via scan and email. Just be sure to send your payment in sufficient time to get to the AGO. If your church or organization employer pays your dues directly (i.e., they send the check directly to the AGO), get them to mail the payment ASAP. Again, the payment needs to be at the AGO on or before your renewal date, and they will need a copy of the invoice. So, if you have not yet paid your June 1st, July 1st, or August 1st renewal dues, NOW is the time to take care of it. Re-instatement can be time-consuming, so avoid it!!

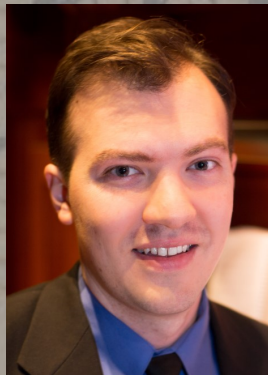

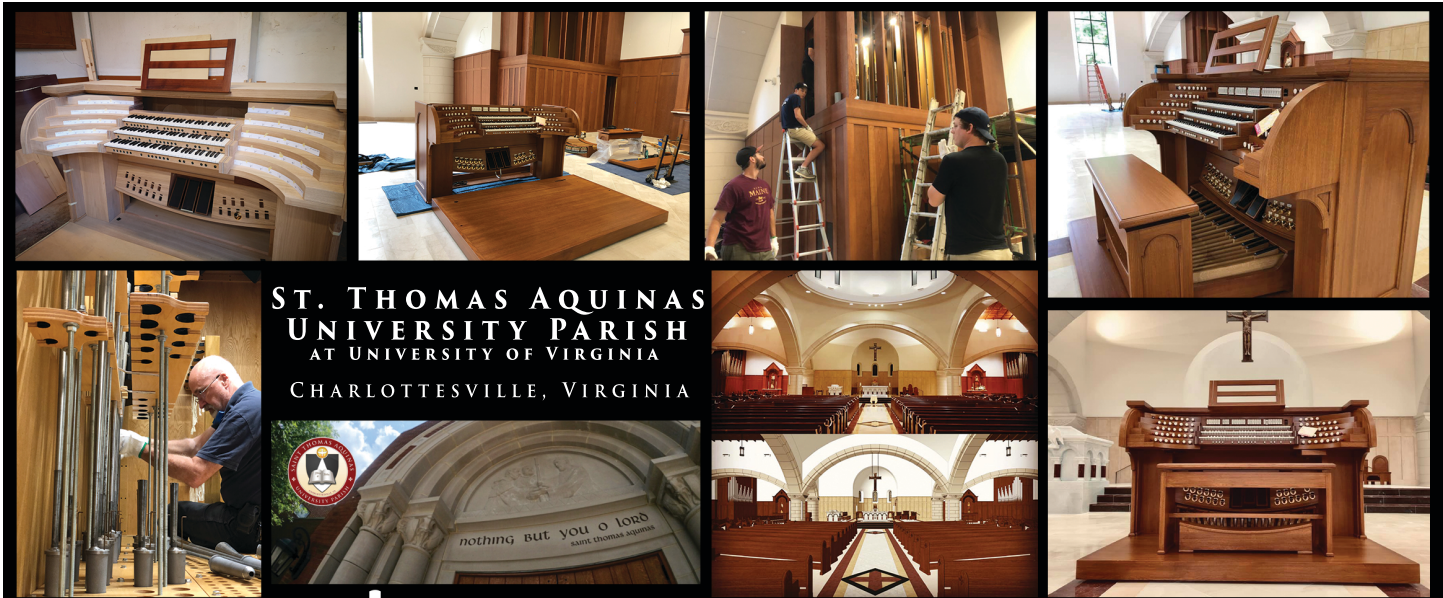
