Described by Fanfare magazine as a "complete musician, totally adept and utterly stylish in everything she plays," Anne Laver maintains an active career as a concert organist, scholar, and pedagogue. She has given organ concerts in Europe, Scandinavia, Africa, and throughout the United States and has been a featured recitalist at conventions of the American Guild of Organists, the Organ Historical Society, the Westfield Center for Historical Keyboard Studies, and the Göteborg International Organ Academy (Sweden). In 2010, she won second prize in the AGO National Young Artist Competition in Organ Performance (NYACOP). Her debut recording, "Reflections of Light" (Loft, 2019) received favorable reviews and has been aired on nationally syndicated radio programs, including WXXI FM's With Heart and Voice and American Public Media's Pipedreams.



Anne is equally at home playing antique and modern organs and tailors her programs to the specific organ at hand. An advocate for new music and diversifying the organ repertoire, Anne has worked with composer Natalie Draper to offer programs for composers who want to write for the organ. She has given world premieres of works by Draper, Eric Heumann, Jordan Alexander Key, and Ivan Božičević.

Anne is passionate about advocacy for the organ and the encouragement of young organists. In her position as Assistant Professor of Organ and University Organist at Syracuse University's Setnor School of Music, she helps educate the next generation of organists and church musicians. She also serves as artistic director for the Malmgren Concert Series at Hendricks Chapel, coordinates the annual Arthur Poister Competition in Organ Playing, and hosts educational programs for youth in collaboration with local chapters of the American Guild of Organists. Anne has taught and led outreach programs at the Eastman School of Music, most recently serving as Visiting Professor of Organ from 2020 to 2022. She has also chaired national committees for the American Guild of Organists, the Organ Historical Society, and the Westfield Center.

Anne's organ studies have been with Mark Steinbach at Brown University, Jacques van Oortmerssen at the Conservatory of Amsterdam, and Hans Davidsson, William Porter, and David Higgs while pursuing masters and doctoral degrees at the Eastman School of Music.

Rheinberger's Second Organ Concerto in G Minor To Be Performed

In Central Virginia, the opportunity to hear a Romantic organ concerto performed live with a sizeable orchestra is extremely rare. This is exactly what will happen when **Bruce Stevens** performs Josef Rheinberger's thrilling Organ Concerto in G Minor, op. 177, with a 22-piece orchestra conducted by **Jason Brown**. Premiered in Munich in 1894 with Richard Strauss conducting, this piece is Rheinberger's masterwork and sums up the 19th-century German Romantic style with its sweeping melodies, rich harmonic language, bold gestures, and wide range of expression. It is undoubtedly one of the top two or three works for organ and orchestra ever written. Moreover, the Andover organ at First Presbyterian suits this music particularly well, for it's tonal qualities of generous fundamental tone, huge bass, suave voicing, and flexible winding enable it to blend perfectly with an orchestra, much like the best 19th-century organs in Germany and America. Also appearing on the concert with the orchestra will be the First Presbyterian Choir and guest musicians **Margaret Taylor Woods** and **Daniel Stipe** in works by Bach, Vivaldi, Handel, Mendelssohn, René Clausen, and Morten Lauridsen.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

with Donald Traser

This month we take a look at some old photos of the Seventh Street Christian Church, now located on Grove and Malvern avenues. The church began in 1832 and occupied their first building, known as the Sycamore Church, taking its name from a sycamore tree which shaded its entrance, in 1833. It was located on Eleventh Street between Broad and Marshall streets. Philadelphia architect Samuel Sloan (1815-1884) designed a new and larger gothic church for the members at the corner of Grace and Seventh streets, opened on July 14, 1872, at which time the name was changed.

Sloan's prowess in many architectural styles is exemplified by another Richmond landmark, the Leigh Street Baptist Church of the 1850s, an exemplar of Greek Revival architecture, now occupied by Church Hill Presbyterian Church. It's odd that both of these churches carried the name of the cross street rather than that which they faced! Some folks may be familiar with another of Sloan's masterworks, the fanciful and uncompleted mansion, *Longwood*, also referred to as Nutt's Folly, in Natchez, Mississippi.

The Seventh Street Church had a Hook & Hastings organ of 1894, Opus 1624, 2 manuals and 21 ranks, which was replaced by Austin Organs' Opus 1270 of 1924, 3 manuals and 27 ranks. That organ was moved to the church's current location, to be replaced by Schantz's Opus 2011, 3 manuals and 41 ranks, in 1992. See *The Organ in Richmond* for more details.

The interior photo which appears here is probably of the Austin organ, though the date of the photo is unknown.
