STUDENT BIOGRAPHIES

Jacob Berg began studying piano at the age of 9 due primarily to boredom and a curiosity towards the large instrument in the family room. After receiving a degree in Music Composition from Shenandoah Conservatory of Music, he moved to New York City in 2010 to pursue work as a freelance composer for animation and films, studying with Manhattan based composer Edgar Grana and conducting the premiere of his operetta, "Tashi Tibet". COVID-19 saw Jacob relocate to Virginia, the home of his youth, and begin work as an accompanist for various churches in his hometown. After moving to the Richmond area in 2021 it became readily apparent that the inclusion of organ in his list of proficiencies was a necessity. He began studies with Grant Hellmers after becoming an AGO scholar in 2022, and continues his work as a second year student. You can find him accompanying at St Gabriel's parish in Chesterfield, with the many choirs of Richmond Allied Voices, or simply playing impossibly large board games long into the night with his wife, Ally.





Patrick Dahlman is a lifelong pianist and a recent graduate of the JMU jazz studies program. Since relocating to Richmond in 2021 he has worked as a wedding and church musician and plays in numerous original acts performing throughout the city and across the state. He has also been active as a freelancer working alongside some of the best jazz musicians Virginia has to offer. This past year he accepted the position as Director of Music Ministry at Emmanuel Episcopal at Brook Hill. He remains excited about continuing to grow there as an organist, worship leader, and director.

Jacob Giancaterino grew up in Midlothian, VA and attended Midlothian High School, where he played in the show choir band led by Mrs. Michelle Graham. In 2022, he graduated Summa Cum Laude in Piano Performance and Magna Cum Laude in Marketing Management from Virginia Tech. As a music major, he studied privately with Dr. Richard Masters and Dr. Sarah Rushing, while participating in masterclasses given by Dr. David Korevaar, Jonathan Biss, and Conrad Tao. A lover of vocal music, Jacob sang in the Virginia Tech choirs for 3 years and took a semester of "Opera Workshop." Jacob also served as a lead musician at Blacksburg United Methodist Church and Christiansburg Church of the Brethren. Since returning to the Richmond area, Jacob has furthered his interest in church music through organ studies with Dr. Robert Gallagher and service on the music staff at Huguenot Road Baptist Church. Additionally, he is a baritone in the Richmond Symphony Chorus and has studied privately with Russell Wilson (piano) and James Taylor (voice).





William Tan is an organist and pianist in Richmond, VA. He has studied piano since age five with Gloria Swanson and completed ten years of the National Guild of Piano Teachers' Guild Auditions. He began studying organ in January 2023, quickly rising to become Organ Scholar at St. Andrew's Oregon Hill, where he served for eight months. He was awarded a 2023-2024 Richmond Chapter of the American Guild of Organists (AGO) Scholarship, and enjoys studying with Daniel Stipe, Principal Organist at All Saints Episcopal Church. He regularly substitutes for other organists in the Richmond area and performs recitals. William particularly loves the music of Couperin (le Grand), Bach, Mozart, and Durufle.

A SUMMER PROJECT FOR EVERY CHAPTER MEMBER

Last November, Chapter member Daniel Stipe led a wonderful meeting/workshop on effective hymn-playing, including harmonizations and improvisation. It was wonderful, and soon I was thinking, "I'm sure I could do that!" If you had similar thoughts that day or over the years, we have a project for you!

The Executive Committee is sponsoring a summer project we're calling 'Reharmonizations 2024," and we're inviting all members to participate. The primary goals of this project are for members to try something new, to stretch our hymn-playing chops, to put together a booklet of these reharmonizations for the members, and to have fun.

Between May and September, interested members are invited to try their hand at writing new harmonizations for public domain hymn tunes. We will provide a list of about 100 'eligible' tunes, and provide guidance on how to determine whether or not a tune is in the public domain, if you want to use another hymn tune. This allows us to publish the reharmonizations without facing copyright issues. The reharmonizations are to be written for congregational singing, without regard to the text (which often is not in the public domain), and with the tune prominently heard. We anticipate copyrighting the resulting submissions in the name of the Chapter so we can distribute them among our own members. Who knows? Maybe we'll have created a best-seller!!

You can use notation software if you have it, or can write out the reharmonizations on score paper and we will transcribe it into software for you. At the end of the summer, we'll collect all submissions, format them into consistent presentation, and put them together in a booklet. We hope to get 1-3 new pieces from each member who participates. This is not a competition, nor is it mandatory – it's just a way for each of us to try something new and share it with our chapter colleagues.

More details will be provided at the May 13 chapter meeting and in the June newsletter.

Last night, I attended the 2024 AGO Gala in Atlanta, which honored Ray and Beth Chenault and featured the Chenaults in recital playing a small fraction of the works they have commissioned for organ duo from 1979 (a rather fiendish toccata by Arthur Wills) to this year (a piece by Nicholas White in memory of recently deceased composers Charles Callahan and Rachel Laurin, whose music was also featured on the program). Ray and Beth did their undergraduate study at VCU, and are members of the Richmond Chapter, so I was glad to be able to be present for the event!

In addition to honoring a significant figure (or figures!) in the organ world each year, the Gala serves as a fundraiser for the AGO Endowment Fund, which is used to generate income for educational programs. Our last Chapter program of the season, on May 13 at Westminster Presbyterian Church, highlights one of our own contributions to the education of organists in the form of a recital given by our four Scholarship students. Two of them are in their second year in the program, and the Executive Committee voted to fund two additional students (in previous years, the scholarships were capped at three students) after both gave strong auditions last summer. Many thanks to Scott Hayes for overseeing the program, to the students and their teachers, and to Kenna Payne and Westminster Presbyterian for hosting!

At the May meeting, we will also hold Chapter elections. 
FROM THE ARCHIVES


First, we must note an error that was entirely the fault of your columnist, who clicked on the wrong item. The organ photo shown last month was actually a Hook & Hastings organ in the former Bainbridge Street Baptist Church rather than the featured Broad Street Methodist Church. The correct photo is included to the right.

Our feature this month is about two long-gone buildings of the Grace Street Baptist Church, predecessor of today's Grace Church in Windsor Farms. It began in 1833 as the city's Third Baptist Church and was located on Marshall Street at the corner of Second Street. A move soon took place to the corner of Grace and Third streets where a new building was erected and called Grace Street Church, the basement being first occupied in 1844. No information has survived to indicate whether there was an organ in this building.

Despite its building being only 45 years old, the decision was made in 1890 to demolish this structure and replace it with another on the same site. Once more, the basement was the first portion to be occupied in 1891. The entire structure was completed in 1894, and the newspapers lauded it as the largest, costliest, and most elaborate church in Richmond. And there was an organ: Hook & Hastings Opus 1328, of two manuals and 24 "registers." It was short-lived, however. The entire structure was reduced to ashes early in 1896. The first two photos on the next page show the organ, specifications of which have not survived, and the burned-out ruins.







Hastings supplied Opus 1888, two manuals and 21 registers; again no specifications (pictured below). The 1901 building managed to last a little longer, but in 1923 the decision was made to abandon the Grace Street location altogether for a move to Grove Avenue and the Boulevard. The third Grace Street Church was demolished, and some of the stonework was
