MEET THE COMPOSER

The Richmond Chapter of the American Guild of Organists welcomes composer Rebecca Groom te Velde, who will discuss her background, approach to composition, and her work as co-editor of the Oxford Hymn Settings for Organists series. She and several Chapter members will play examples from the most recent volumes of the Oxford series that showcase a breadth of styles and compositional techniques.

Dinner will be provided through St. Stephen's, and will cost \$25/person. The menu will consist of herb-crusted pork tenderloin with gravy, penne pasta, sweet potato and squash hash, and broccoli salad. Please register at [this link](#) by **Tuesday, February 11**. Rebecca Groom te Velde, M.Mus., AAGO, is a fourth-generation organist and composer. In Sept. 2024 she was named Organist/Director of Music Emerita at First Presbyterian Church in Stillwater, Oklahoma where she served 33 years as Organist, the last ten also as Director of Music. 2024 also marked her 50th year as a professional church musician. After studying organ, composition and church music with her father, Lester H. Groom, at Seattle Pacific University (B.A.), she earned her master's degree in organ performance and literature from The University of Western Ontario, where her organ studies were with Hugh J. McLean and composition with Jack Behrens. In 1980, she was a finalist in the National Organ Playing Competition of the American Guild of Organists and a participant in the Flor Peeters



International Masterclass in Mechelen, Belgium. A full grant from the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) enabled her post-graduate organ study in 1980-81 with Michael Schneider at the Musikhochschule Köln and with Almut Rössler in Düsseldorf. She has concertized in the U.S., Canada, Germany, England and Switzerland, and taught as an adjunct instructor at Oklahoma State University (Introduction to Music) and Oklahoma City University (organ).

As a composer, Becky has published with Oxford University Press, Santa Barbara Music Publishing, Darcey Press, GIA, and Selah Music Publishing. She is the U.S. co-editor and a contributing composer for Oxford Hymn Settings for Organists Vols. 1–9, together with U.K. co-editors David Blackwell (Vols. 1-6), David Bednall (Vol. 7), and Alan Bullard (Vols. 8-9). She was a commissioned composer for the AGO 2016 Houston national convention Bayoubüchlein project, and the Tulsa 2023 Southwest Region AGO convention commissioned her to write an organ piece for Brent te Velde to premier during his solo recital at that convention.

In retirement, Becky is already enjoying having more time for composition, and she hopes to shepherd a growing number of completed commissions into print, including the Partita on *Bereden väg för Herran* that is dedicated to Brent.

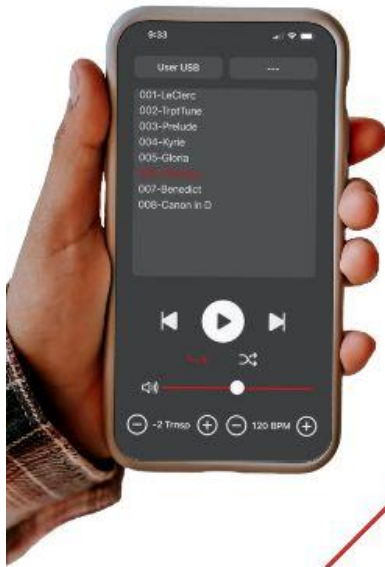
