## MAY CHAPTER MEETING SUMMARY

The Richmond Chapter met to present two students in the Chapter's New Organist Scholarship Program in a concert for the public at First Presbyterian Church (1988 Andover Organ Op. 100, 3m, 48 rks). Performing were scholarship recipients Patrick Dahlman and William Tan, both having advanced to employment as church organists following two or more years of organ study. Both entered the scholarship with strong keyboard skills. The Chapter's scholarship recipients receive private lessons with experienced instructors who are compensated by the Chapter. Dahlman, now Director of Music Ministry at Emmanuel Episcopal Church, Brook Hill, studied in 2024-25 with Dr. Christopher Reynolds, Director of Music at St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Richmond. Tan, Principal Organist at Bethlehem Lutheran Church, Richmond, studied with Daniel Stipe, Principal Organist of All Saints Episcopal Church, Richmond. Dahlman played Mendelssohn: Prelude in G, op. 37; Johannes Matthias Michel: Bossa Nova; Vierne: Carillon, op. 31, no. 11. Tan played J. S. Bach: four settings of "Nun komm, der Heiden Heiland:" Chorale Preludes BWV 599 & 659; Trio, BWV 660; Fughetta, BWV 661; Andre J. Thomas: Fantasy on the Negro Spiritual "Walk Together, Children;" Duruflé: Prélude et Choral Varié, op. 4. Members elected officers and dined before the concert.

## ARE YOU A COBBLER?

Are You a Cobbler?

There is a proverb that says, **'The cobbler's son always goes barefoot.'** Are the members of the AGO Richmond Chapter a bunch of cobblers?

The Executive Committee has developed a new summertime project for the members of the Richmond AGO chapter. Just as with the 2024 Reharmonization project, it is not mandatory nor competitive. But unlike the 2024 project, it doesn't even need a response to the Chapter. **During the summer of 2025, we encourage the members to plan their own funeral** – to NOT be a cobbler's son or daughter.

Of course, if you've already done so, well done!

But a great many of us have not put pen to paper in this planning. I bet it's all in your head! Don't just think of overall plans, but all of the details. After all, the vast majority of us have played in / are playing in / or will play in a religious setting in our careers, so we should consider ourselves to be experts in sacred music.

**So, here's the challenge - think about and make decisions concerning your own funeral, consulting with friends / family / religious leaders, writing it down, and putting copies of it with family members or other people and in safe places.**

These plans might include the following –

Locations – church, funeral homes, elsewhere

Obituaries – yes or no, contents (maybe even write it)

Remains - burial vs. cremation

Church service – maybe not, mass, communion, other style

Readings – Scriptures, other items

Music – organ music, hymns, solos, choirs

People – pastoral leaders, speakers, readers, family members

Gravesite service or not

How can this become a chapter event?

First, we want people to actually think about their funerals and memorial services, and to commit their wishes, desires, and plans to writing. And hopefully we can each set aside time this summer to do just that. This can be worked on at the organ, at the kitchen table, on the beach, on the plane, at family gatherings, etc.

Second, members might discuss their thoughts on this topic with their AGO colleagues. Two heads are often better than one, even in the very personal exercise.

Third (TOTALLY OPTIONAL) - consider sharing your thoughts, ideas, and plans for the music with the Chapter. Other Chapter members might be stuck in their own thought process and decision-making, and we could publish (anonymously, and with a member's permission, of course) some details of music choices in the newsletter. We might even be able to summarize submissions for not only music, but also scriptures and readings.

We do ask that you let me know if you are going to accept the challenge and (at the end of the summer) how you fare. This will give us a good indication of interest and participation of this summertime project.

Wouldn't it be nice to get this out of the way?
