Thomas Sheehan began his new position as Director of Music at Montreal's Christ Church Cathedral in August of this year. Until then, he was the primary musician at the National Cathedral in Washington, D.C., where he served with distinction as Cathedral Organist and Interim Director of Music. His work there included leading all aspects of a rich and complex music program, both liturgical and concert-based, as well as playing for several high-profile civic events, including the state funeral of President Jimmy Carter. As the primary Cathedral organist, he played many services and recitals and managed the renovation project of the Cathedral's pipe organ. Prior to his time in Washington, Tom held positions at the Memorial Church at Harvard University, Saint Mark's Church in Philadelphia, and Trinity Episcopal Church in Princeton.

Tom is a graduate of the Curtis Institute of Music, where he received diplomas in organ and harpsichord, studying with Alan Morrison and Leon Schelhase. He holds a Doctor of Musical Arts degree from Boston University, where he was a student of Peter

Sykes and wrote a dissertation on the work of one of his notable predecessors at the National Cathedral, Richard Wayne Dirksen. He received both the Master of Music and Bachelor of Music degrees from Westminster Choir College in Princeton as a student of Ken Cowan. In 2016, he was named one of The Diapason's "20 under 30" rising stars in the field of organ performance. He has performed as an organist throughout the United States, in Canada, and in Europe, including recital appearances in Reykjavík, Toulouse, and Montreal.



ANOTHER INVITATION FROM KENNA PAYNE






