DEAN'S LETTER TO MEMBERS



As I'm writing this, it's not even Halloween yet and there are already Christmas-themed commercials on television, which is both irritating as a general principle and also an annoying reminder that I still have some Advent/Christmas planning to do. Some of that isn't my fault - we're (finally!) moving the St. Mary's Christmas pageant off of the 4pm Christmas Eve service to the afternoon of Advent IV, but we're also adding a family-friendly Christmas Eve service at 11am, and it's not clear what the shape of that is going to be just yet and I can't make concrete plans until we've figured that out - but there are some

things that I really do need to get bolted down that have been getting pushed aside by everything else that's been happening.

Among those things, of course, was our first Recital Series performance of the season, a brilliant recital by Tom Sheehan at St. Stephen's Episcopal Church. The music covers a range of styles and skill levels, so hopefully everyone who attends will come away with something they might want to use. And a big thank you as well to Doug Brown, who is not only hosting us at Ginter Park Pres, but is also cooking us dinner, which is why there's no charge for this one! Please do still RSVP, though, so that we can have nametags for everyone who shows up.

If you've visited the Chapter website recently, you might have noticed that you're no longer seeing warnings that the site isn't secure. 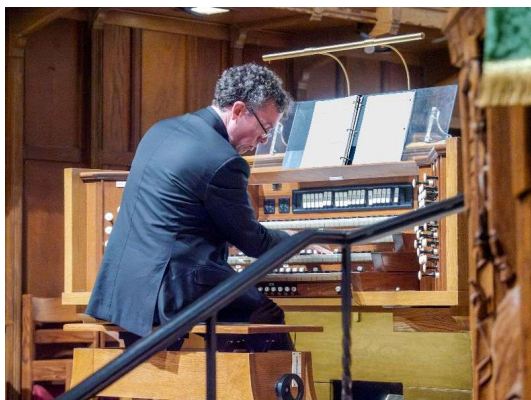

ANOTHER INVITATION FROM KENNA PAYNE

Over the summer I received an email message with an interesting challenge –

The Director of the Royal School of Church Music (UK) will be playing a 25-hour marathon in November as part of their current program, “Hands on with Handel: Play Your Part!” This seems to be an annual part of their Play the Organ Year 20xx. As part of that marathon, he's invited organists around the world to play **Handel's “Largo” from Xerxes - *Ombra mai fui*** – at **2 PM local time on Saturday, November 22, 2025**. This is offered as an opportunity for organists to host an ‘open console’ session, and to introduce people to the organ, for both students and listeners.

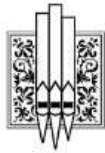
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
