Dean's Letter  
February 2026

Happy New Year! I hope your Advent/Christmas/other holiday services and

concerts all went well and that you had more downtime afterwards than I did - we went up north to visit family for about 6 days and then I had to play a funeral on January 2nd, so that was pretty much the end of my holiday. It's also an early Easter year, which means Ash Wednesday is in less than a month as I'm writing this, which means I've got some planning yet to do...

Our 2026 Chapter programming is already off and running! Many thanks to Daniel Sañez for a very insightful presentation on improvisation. As someone who is (I think?) a pretty decent noodler but very far from Daniel's level of skill and ingenuity, it was really fascinating to hear him break down some approaches to developing greater facility in that area. I'm going to try to work his ideas into my own practice going forward, starting with just making more of a habit of practicing scale harmonizations! Thanks as well to William Tan for hosting us at Bethlehem Lutheran Church, and to Joel Kumro and Grant Holcomb for organizing dinner at Village Cafe beforehand.

We've had to make a change to our February program - we had hoped to hear a presentation on the restoration being done on the organ at First Baptist Church, but as sometimes happens with these projects, the work isn't yet completed! We're hoping to be able to relocate that program to our next season, but for now: **We're going to do a Members' Recital on the Pasi Op. 5 organ at Saint Benedict Catholic Church (300 N Sheppard St, Richmond). We're looking for ca. 75 minutes of music, and there's no particular theme into which you have to fit repertoire choices. Since I live very close to Saint Benedict, we'll have a cocktail hour prior to the recital at my house, starting at 5:45 PM. We'll have beer, wine, and hors d'oeuvres available. I'm not sure it's a great idea to post my home address on something that's going to wind up on our webpage, so just email me if you're planning to come and I'll tell you where I live!

Spring is also the time to prepare for Chapter elections, and I'm very grateful to Steve Henley for chairing the Nominating Committee. 
*Evensong for the Last Sunday after the Epiphany*

## RECAP: JANUARY CHAPTER MEETING

**Richmond, January 13, 2026:** Gifted improviser and AGO member Daniel Sáñez spoke on improvisation techniques at the chapter meeting held in the gallery of Bethlehem Lutheran Church (1983 Taylor and Boody, Op. 7, 2m, 24 stops, 34 ranks, Kirnberger III). Introducing historical improvisation with insight, wit and clarity, he encouraged beginners to harmonize scales, with basic chromatic modifications and changes of direction. He then encouraged performing rudimentary cadences with increasing complexity, followed by harmonic progressions, ground basses, and simple fugues. Moving to contemporary improvisation, he opined that, for novices, modern styles are easier than classical forms. Prior to Daniel's appointment as director of music, organist, and choirmaster at Richmond's Cathedral of the Sacred Heart in 2015, he served parishes in New York City; Washington, DC; and at the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. A native of Hollywood, CA, he holds degrees from Boston College, Oberlin Conservatory, and, as a Fulbright scholar, from the Hochschule für Musik und Theater in Leipzig. He has recorded two albums of improvisations (CDs and streaming) and demonstrations on YouTube. (Report and photography by Bill Van Pelt)



Acclaimed organist Peggy Haas Howell will present a solo organ recital at St. Paul's Episcopal Church, 42 E. Main Street, Salem, VA 24153, on Friday, February 27, 2026 at 7:00 PM.

An internationally respected recitalist, Ms. Howell has performed widely throughout the United States and Europe. Known for her commanding musicianship and technical wizardry at the organ console, she won top prizes in many organ playing competitions, including first prize in the National Young Artists Organ Playing Competition of the American Guild of Organists (1974), and a shared top prize in St. Albans International Organ Interpretation Competition in England (1977). She currently serves as Organist and Choirmaster at St. John's Episcopal Church in Lynchburg, Virginia, and as National Vice President and Councillor for Competitions and New Music for the American Guild of Organists. She is also the Director of Cantate Children's and Youth Choir, a community group dedicated to bringing classical choral music to the children and youth of central Virginia.

Ms. Howell holds a Bachelor of Arts in Church Music from Susquehanna University and a Master of Sacred Music from Union Theological Seminary in New York City, with additional advanced study at the Staatliche Hochschule für Musik und darstellende Kunst in Hamburg, Germany. Her distinguished teachers include James Boeringer, Heinz Wunderlich, Charles Dodsley Walker, Cherry Rhodes, and Harald Vogel. Her extensive career as a recording artist, recitalist, teacher, and church musician was memorably summarized by Cleveland's *The Plain Dealer*, which praised her as a "play-anything virtuoso."

Spanning several centuries, this recital program will weave together organ repertoire of grandeur, intimacy, and spiritual depth. Works by Georg Böhm, Johann Sebastian Bach, C.P.E. Bach, Felix Mendelssohn-Bartholdy, and contemporary composer Dan Locklair will be featured, alongside anonymous Renaissance dances from the 1599 Suzanne van Soldt manuscript. Highlights include Bach's monumental *Fantasy and Fugue in G Minor* (BWV 542) and Locklair's *Salem Sonata*, a work of profound spiritual resonance.

Ms. Howell's recital promises a compelling and richly varied musical experience, showcasing the expressive power of the organ across historical periods. All are welcome. This concert is free and open to the public. For more information, visit [salemstpauls.org](http://salemstpauls.org).


