## PROGRAM PREVIEW: LOOKING AHEAD TO 2026/2027

While the Program Committee is putting the finishing touches on next year's calendar, we're pleased to share an early preview of what's ahead.

**April** will feature a Members' Recital: "April in Oregon Hill" celebrating the newly renovated organ at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church.

We'll close the season in **May** at St. Mary's Episcopal in Goochland with our annual Scholarship Recipient Recital.

We are grateful to all who help make our programs possible, and we look forward to seeing you!

## MUSIC GIVE-AWAY PROGRAM REVAMPED

In June, the Executive Committee discussed the status of the music give-away, a program of many years, for which collected donations are credited to the Student Scholarship program. The discussion was prompted by the significant increase in collected music that we have received lately, from two prominent music directors / organists.

The collected music that we are now storing exceeds 35 boxes, most of which is not organ music, but something else - choral music, instrumental music, reference books and hymnals, handbell music, vocal soloist books, CDs, etc. We are not going to be able to keep moving all of these boxes to the September and May chapter meetings, so a plan is in place to re-organize, cull, and donate or discard any non-organ music before the end of the summer.

Sometime this summer, a group of volunteers will meet to go through the non-organ music boxes and sort, re-box, and/or discard anything that is not in good condition. Then, we'll have two days when members can come and see if there is anything that might be usable to them. At the end of the summer, we'll see what can be done with the remaining non-organ music.

If you or anyone you know might be interested in taking a large portion of the choral music for your own program, please let me know. We continue to investigate other people and groups who might be interested. We have investigated out-of-town benefactors (both for-profit and non-profit), but donations to those groups involve shipping the desired music at our expense. This will be far too time-consuming to pull out the desired items and too expensive for us to ship.

In the future, we will accept only organ music (including organ + instrumentalists) and reference materials for keeping, storing, moving, and giving away.

Watch the email messages over the summer for the dates and times of helping sort through and of coming to look through the music. We hope you can come and lend a hand!

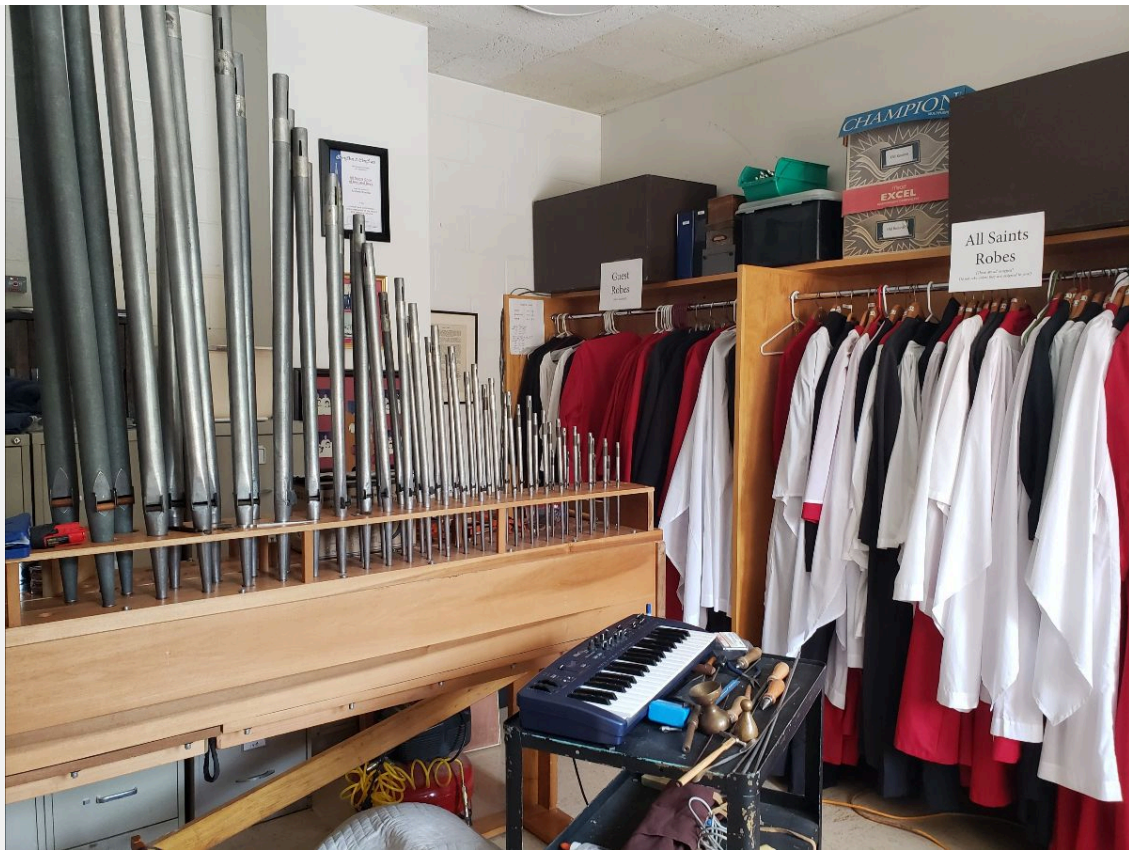

INTERESTING SIGHTS ABOUT TOWN



German recording engineer Christoph Martin Frommen erects a total of 12 microphones in Sacred Heart Cathedral for a recording made last month by Isabelle Demers of organ works composed by Canadians Rachel Laurin and Raymond Daveluy. The recording will be released on Frommen's label, Aeolus, as a surround-sound SACD. Frommen holds university degrees in organ performance and as a Tonmeister.



A rare, possibly unique, sight is a church choir's robing room equipped with an organbuilder's voicing machine. There it was at All Saints Episcopal Church on River Road when I visited on June 6. The Director of Music at All Saints is Scott Hayes, who is also a professional organbuilder specializing in voicing and tonal design as Tonal Director of the Muller Pipe Organ Co., Croton, Ohio. Scott and the firm are renovating the 1967 Austin Op. 2472 at All Saints. Scott is also a past dean of the Richmond chapter.

## JUNE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE READOUT

### Executive Committee Meeting Notes

June 16, 2026, Ginter Park Presbyterian Church

Kenna Payne presented Chapter Financial Statements through 5/31/2026 (11 months) and reported that dues are on budget for the year and that the investment account roared back in April and May. Kenna Payne reported that the new policy/procedure for becoming a “Chapter Friend” has been posted to the website.

Joel Kumro reported that the Program Committee has tentatively planned programs for the upcoming 2026-2027 season.

Kenna Payne reported that the Chapter has accumulated a very large collection of organ and choral music (over 50 boxes) and suggested that a small group of members be formed to cull through the materials, only keeping and making available the organ music and reference material. An article explaining the new process and seeking help with the clean-up this summer will be in the July/August newsletter. The music collection will then be available at both the September and May chapter meetings for members to peruse.

A question has been raised as to whether the Stoplist should be available to non-members. After some discussion, it was decided that it would be permissible for non-members to subscribe to *The Stoplist*. Non-members will not be added to the *Keynotes* email list that goes out from Betty Girardeau.

The Richmond Chapter decided against conducting a POE+ in 2027 but may consider conducting a POE Tech in the future.

Kenna Payne welcomed the incoming Members-at-Large, Grant Hellmers and Jennifer Uzel, and the incoming Auditor, Doug Brown. She also thanked the outgoing Dean, Ryan Tibbetts, for his three years of service and the outgoing Members-at-Large, Mary Campbell and Elizabeth Melcher Davis.
